

## Texas Equine Online Horse Show Rules

Join us for some horse show fun! Participating in the Texas Equine Online Horse Shows is a super easy four step process:

1. Sign up for classes
2. Film your entry
3. Submit your entry for judging
4. Receive awards in a timely manner!

Please register on the website by the registration date deadline. Videos will be accepted until the show deadline. Results will be available after judging is complete.

Classes available:

- Western Horsemanship
- English Equitation
- Showmanship
- Trail (western tack required)
- Lunge Line

Divisions:

- Lead Line (walk only-Open to all riders. Assistant must remain attached the entire time)
  - Level 1 Youth (walk only-Open to riders 8 and under)
  - Level 2 Youth (walk/jog-Open to riders 9-13)
  - Level 3 Youth (walk/jog-Open to riders 14-18)
  - Adult Amateur (walk/jog-Open to riders 19-64)
  - Vintage (walk/jog-Open to riders 65+)
  - Level 1 Open (Walk only-Open to all riders)
  - Level 2 Open (Walk/Jog-Open to all riders)
  - Level 3 Open (Walk/Jog/Lope-Open to all riders)
  - Stars & Stirrups (Walk/Jog-Open to veterans & first responders)
- \*Participants age as of Jan 1 of the current year.
- \*Participants with amateur status may enter in their walk/jog age group AND their corresponding open division. For example: A Level 2 or 3 Youth participant may also compete in Level 2 Open.
- \*Participants competing in Lead Line and Level 1 Youth need to remain in those divisions.
- \*Participants competing in Level 3 Open may not enter any other divisions.

Video submission:

- Upon completion of the registration form and payment, you will receive an email with a link for the video submission form.
- Once the videos are filmed, please upload each video to YouTube and add the link to the appropriate section.
- Videos must be submitted by show deadline. Entries submitted after the deadline will not be judged.

**-Please stand at the “X” noted on each pattern so that the camera angle is the same for each submission.**

#### Judging:

- In order to build relations and empower the next generation of equine professionals, judging will be conducted by collegiate judging teams or 4H judging teams.
- All Around Shows will be judged according to AQHA rules.
- Ranch Versatility Shows will be judged according to AQHA rules.
- Dressage shows will be judged by L program judges, r or R judges when classes are available and will utilize USDF and FEI rules.

#### Horses:

- The same horse may be used in the same classes if ridden by different participants.
- Each participant must compete on the same horse in all of their classes in order to qualify for high point awards.

#### Points:

- High Point and Reserve High Point will be awarded for each division in each show.
- Points will be calculated for each class in each division. The total number of points will depend on the number of participants. For example: 4 people enter a class. 1st place will receive 4 points, 2nd place will receive 3 points, 3rd place will receive 2 points and 4th place will receive 1 point.
- Participants must compete in a minimum of three classes to qualify for High Point Awards.
- Participants must choose one division for the rider and horse pair to attain high points in.
- Participants will receive points for each class throughout the year.
- Points will be awarded to each participant and horse combination.
- Points will be accumulated from each show to work towards year end High Point Awards.
- Year end High Point and Reserve High Point will be awarded for each division at the conclusion of the 2025 show season.

#### Cost:

- One class: \$25
- Two classes: \$45 (\$5 discount)
- Three classes: \$65 (\$10 discount)
- Four classes: \$85 (\$15 discount)
- Five classes: \$105 (\$20 discount)
- Multiple class discount applies to one participant competing in multiple classes.

#### Attire:

- Closed toed shoes with a heel are required.
- All participants under the age of 18 years old must wear a helmet.

-All participants must either wear a helmet or western hat for all classes-including lunge line and showmanship.

-While this is a schooling show, please make an effort to dress appropriately: collared shirt and nice pants.

-Show coats are not required.

Patterns:

Will be posted on the Texas Equine Online Horse Show page and will be available by the registration date for each show.

Important dates:

-Registration for the Spring Show is open from February 1st, 2025 to **March 1st, 2025.**

-Video Submission for the Spring Show is open from February 1st, 2025 to March 15th, 2025.

-Registration for the Summer Show is open from May 1st, 2025 to **June 1st, 2025.**

-Video Submission for the Summer Show is open from May 1st, 2025 to June 15th, 2025.

-Registration for the Fall Show is open from August 1st, 2025 to **September 1st, 2025.**

-Video Submission for the Fall Show is open from August 1st, 2025 to September 15th, 2025.

-Registration for the Winter Show is open from November 1st, 2025 to **December 1st, 2025.**

-Video Submission for the Winter Show is open from November 1st, 2025 to December 15th, 2025.

Partial refunds are available if requested by the registration deadline. A 5% service fee will be deducted from the refunded amount.
